**Supervisor of Elections has qualified 22 Levy County candidates for 2024**

At noon on June 14, 2024, Florida's candidate qualifying period for 2024 closed. "This was an important day because we now know the candidates who will be on the ballot in 2024," said Tammy Jones, Levy County Supervisor of Elections. Local candidates who qualified with Levy County are listed at [www.votelevy.gov](http://www.votelevy.gov).

All voters will have contests to vote on in this Primary Election. There will be three different ballots - a Republican ballot, a Democratic ballot, and a Nonpartisan ballot. The following contests will be on every Levy County voters ballot; Property Appraiser, Sheriff, Superintendent of Schools, County Commissioner, District 1, County Commissioner, District 5, and School Board, District 4. These contests are considered a Universal Primary Contest, which occurs when all candidates in a contest have the same party affiliation and the winner would be unopposed in the General Election.

Republican and Democratic Primary ballots will also include contests in which more than one candidate of the same party qualified. For example, the Levy County Clerk of the Circuit Court and Comptroller is considered a closed primary contest. Republican voters will select one winner out of three Republican candidates. The winner will then face a No Party Affiliation candidate during the General Election. Please note state contests on your ballot will also vary depending on your registered party affiliation.

Voters may notice that a few contests are not listed on their ballot. Those candidates seeking office faced no opposition due to no one qualifying during the designated time. Candidates who this applied to are automatically declared the winner. Some candidates faced no opposition in the Primary and will face their opponent in the General Election.

Voters may change their party at any time, but to be valid for the upcoming primary, the change must be made by July 22, which is also the deadline to register to vote for the Primary Election. Voters can register online at [www.votelevy.gov](http://www.votelevy.gov) or in person at our office.
